**Pecs board**- The Picture Exchange communication boards arrived.


- Facilities was very quick to put them up for us the same day they arrived.

2. Curriculum – our curriculum has changed to the Holistic this year. In each of the curriculum outcomes we now have "Big Ideas" versus specific curriculum outcome. Our teachers have been working with many different groups to help deliver many different big ideas in Science/Social Studies in specific. The have used many activities offered through the Center of Excellence.

Sports Hall of Fame ambassador in our school in grade 4 and 5

- -Indigenous Art work in grade 2
- -Saint John Ambulance read with McGuire the dog- coming every Thursday. (social emotional learning)
- -Science students from UNB-" Let's talk science" in to do hands-on activities with our students.
- -STEM activites with Worlds UNBound.
- -We are receiving a 3D printer from Brilliant Labs- printer makes 3-D objects that are bendable.
- -STU students working on reading with our FI classes. They take small groups of students to do reading interventions one on one and in small groups.
- -Retired teacher coming in to grade 5 class to teach Math with Mme Kelly. They create lesson plans together and have students doing math projects to extend their learning.
- -District leads in Math, Art, Technology, Phys Ed, French Immersion, English language arts, science, have put out PL that many of our teachers have attended. Our AST teacher has also attended many PL sessions which has helped with data collection in Literacy and Math and working towards our school goals
- -we had an assembly for Pink Shirt day where we incorporated our WIG goal and growth mindset. The students were invited to chew gum and think about a stretchy brain versus a brick brain where they can set their minds to accomplish a goal or work on something they can't do "YET". It was very enjoyable and the students were very engaged.
- -working with Gr 4 & 5 students on their upcoming provincial assessment. We are coming up with a plan on how to help them practice and support the students so that they can not have anxiety around the assessment. ESS teachers will be in each classroom to help support the students as they are using their laptop for either practice sessions or the assessment itself. We received accommodations for students which is wonderful helping them with translation, writing answers for them, etc. We are hoping this helps them feel more at ease. The assessments are multiple choice only so there is no requirement for typing/spelling skills they simply click the correct answer. To help ease the possibility of test anxiety, we have been discussing these assessments for many months as well as using the laptops & similar testing to the multiple choice so that they are well prepared and at ease. Our student leaders have been bringing many activities into each classroom REST & RECHARGE, HEALTHY EATING and next we are working on JOYFUL MOVEMENT hopefully these will all help students be more

**Update on new school:** Mr. Geburt sent sheets saying we were approved for the 2024-2025 school year so it will not be listed in the new schools. DEC has indicated that the site will be on the location that Liverpool is currently set at. He also had a meeting with Assist Dept Minister in late January regarding the location and for it to be secured. Unfortunately, it has not been settled with the city as there are a few trees on the location that are designated species at risk so we are not 100% sure the site is set (could be an animal or plant – we are unsure). Due to the amount of growth within the population and construction of new buildings/residences that poses a trouble to find where to place the school. The other issue is access to that area for building – how will they get to access it? All of these issues are hopefully going to be reconciled by mid year. When Mr. Geburt has news he will share it with the committee. Projected for 510 students with max capacity of 643.
