- 4. Partners for Youth- Tom Carney- The program focuses on

- What is Sport3?

Sport3 uses movement, and conversation to create a more interactive and engaging environment for students to dive into social emotional learning.

Sport3 will be held three times throughout the school year. A Partners For Youth facilitator will lead the program, working closely with the school's Sport3 Champion. The program will take place at school.

In partnership with the Lacross Foundation, Partners for Youth Inc., and your school, Sport3 offers a continued learning experience where students and teachers learn together.

Each year we have 3-4 students who are able to attend Mr. Carney's camp in the summer months, for free. It is such a wonderful & adventurous opportunity.

5. Gaia Project- Trash tracker waste audit last week with the Gaia Project. We will be receiving some class data and school data in the next few weeks, which may identify some areas of improvement for reducing our waste and therefore our carbon footprint at school. Students were able to look through our own trash we collected here during the days ahead. They were then to sort the trash into recyclables, compostable and trash. Excellent way for our students to see exactly how much waste we produce daily at school. We also had Let's Talk Science into our STEM classes where students have been able to work with robotics, coding and different science experiments.





6. Eco Schools- track and reward environmental actions that reduce energy and waste, raise awareness and incorporate environmental learning into curriculum. As part of EcoSchools Canada certification I would like to engage any colleagues interested in participating in additional climate actions.
