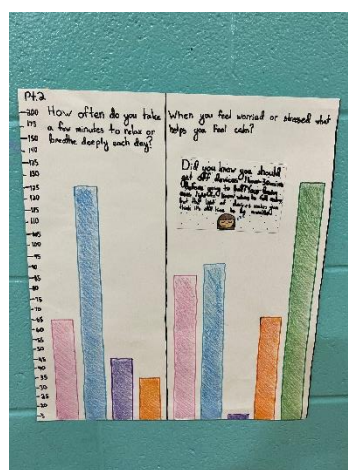
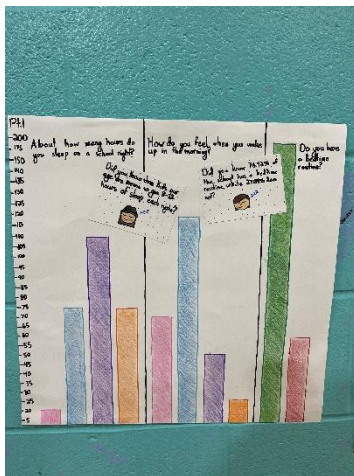

- New Business-
 - Public Meeting- new School – earlier this week, a public meeting was held regarding the new school. About 35 people attended the meeting. Most had concerns regarding the lack of playground space but it was addressed that it will be bigger. Construction will begin in the fall so that the school population can move into the new building so they can demolish the old Liverpool St and make it a soccer field. Both schools will most likely not move in at the same time. They also shared that they do not want either school moving in the winter time. The neighbourhood shared their concerns regarding drainage onto their properties – and that was addressed. BGC was under the assumption that they would have a space in the new school. They were informed 60 days ago that they would not have space for their daycare in the new school. The entire project is expected to be completed by Fall 2029. Photos of the plans were shared with the committee tonight and lengthy discussions were held among our PSSC committee about our input and can any changes be made from this point forward along with the issues we see that are the most concerning regarding this project.

Principal Report:

February 26, 2026

1. Student interns arriving after March Break: 3 interns from STU-Spring Placement (8 weeks) – March 9 - May 1, 2026
2. STEM- hands on project base learning. – classes learning about:
 - Sound
 - Light- shadows
 - Micro Bits-
 - Coda pillars-The Code-a-Pillar teaches the basics of coding, using sequencing and programming, with segments of the caterpillar's body. Each of the eight segments is labeled with different symbols and colors.
 - Hibernation- how animals survive in winter. It gives students meaningful practice with listening skills as well as asking and answering questions. While also addressing important science standards of animal adaptations, hibernation, and migration within an ecosystem.
 - Sugar Shack-In this hands-on building challenge, learners will explore several techniques and develop vocabulary needed in this iconic skilled trade. Learners will build small sugar shacks with “bricks and mortar”, as well as a touch of sweetness, exploring the skills and craftsmanship masons implement in their everyday work
 - Parachute stem-Have you ever wondered what a parachute and an open rain jacket have in common? They both trap air and slow you down when you move fast! In this activity, you design a parachute for a miniature action figure. Tissue paper or a plastic bag and a few strings is all it takes to make your figure into an expert skydiver.
3. Recognition Assemblies- students presented information found on student surveys about the amount of sleep Liverpool students get each night. Screen time was also discussed and the importance of a bedtime routine.
