5. School Plan- 2 Big Goals

Math will help improve the student's mental math and allows them to learn at the level they are at, rather than lumping everyone together as they learn. It allows students & teachers to meet and conference 1 on 1 more often. This after COVID was very important overall for us to implement as there was a lack in the mental math category.

SEL was necessary to revisit and to help students recognize & regulate their emotions as they feel them throughout the day. This will be done through Zones of Regulation primarily for lessons, along with different body breaks and activities. As we welcome newcomers into our school population, to better support them, we would like to implement a system that will buddy them up with another student from their country, as well as making sure the students are prepared to be at school and understand how a school works since some do not attend school prior to moving here.

GOAL 1	
Data Snapshot Summary:	Data collected from playground data, PowerSchool and teacher notes indicates that students are better able to perform academically when they have been pre-taught strategies to self-regulate. Based on the student survey and teacher survey, 55% of teachers feel comfortable in their understanding of SEL.
Goal:	To expend student knowledge of student self-regulation to grow student skills and engagement in their own learning. Implement a matrix of expectations for our school.
Positive Learning and Working Environment (PLWE) Component:	Improvement Process
Indicators of Success:	All Liverpool Staff will use the Zones of Regulation language and SEL language with students. Students will also effectively use this language to describe their emotions.

GOAL 2	
Data Snapshot Summary:	Our Math Improvement Benchmark Data indicates that there is further need to strengthen Number sense and operations in mathematics.
Goal:	By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, students will show improvement in the areas of fact fluency for addition and subtraction using the math running record assessment. All teachers will work with their grade level teams to maximize student learning using the Math Improvement site, Math Running Records, and the building blocks for assessment practices to guide instruction.
Positive Learning and Working Environment (PLWE) Component:	Teaching and Learning
Indicators of Success:	-Pre/ Mid/ Post data from MRR and Math Term assessments being shared with grade level teams and current data wall. - Math word walls to support student learning -Addition and Subtraction Strategy Games and Activities from the MRR - Tier Leveled Activity Tower to build on concepts outlined in the MRR (Ie: First: Add within 10, Second: Add to make 10, Third: Add 10 to make a number, etc.). - Co-Teaching with ESST - Proper and effective use of manipulatives

Like a GPS, Math Running Records pinpoint exactly where students are in their understanding of basic math facts and then outline the next steps toward comprehensive fluency. It is research-based framework by Nikki Newton, to assess students' thinking and move them toward becoming confident, proficient, flexible mathematicians with a very good sense of numbers.


